Recipe of the Month

Apple Cake



- 3 cups plain flour
- 2 cups granulated sugar
- 11/4 cup oil
- 2 eggs
- 2 tsp vanilla
- 1 tsp baking soda

- 1 tsp cinnamon
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 3 cups peeled and chopped apples
- 1 cup chopped pecans

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Sift flour and remeasure making certain to only use 3 cups. Sift again with baking soda, salt, and cinnamon. Set aside. Mix sugar, oil, and eggs together. Add the dry ingredients and then add vanilla. Next, fold in apples and pecans. Mix well. Bake in a sprayed bundt pan for 1 hour and 15 minutes.
